### Welcome Back Miss Sue!

She has her teaching degree in Physical Education; she is YMCA Camp Director Certified and First Aid/CPR Instructor certified. She is looking forward to a summer filled with fun! ### ■ Hiring Requirements

We have a comprehensive pre-employment screening procedure that includes:

- YMCA job application
- Minimum of 3 checked references
- Personal interview with YMCA supervisor
- CORI/SORI checks
- Minimum age is 16

### ■ Staff Certifications

- All staff are required to have current CPR, First Aid and AED certification
- Specialty staff (i.e., lifeguards) maintain certs specific to their program area

### ■ Staff Training

All staff are required to successfully complete a program-specific orientation focusing on discipline, supervision, staff/camper participation, policies, procedures, YMCA Staff Code of Conduct and child abuse prevention.

### ■ Staff: Camper Ratios

School Age - 1:10 • Preschool - 1:8

### ■ YMCA Staff Policies

- In order to protect YMCA staff, volunteers and program participants, the YMCA recommends that at no time during a YMCA program may a staff person be alone with a single child where they cannot be observed by others.
- Staff shall never leave a child unsupervised.
- Staff must use positive techniques of guidance, including redirection, positive reinforcement and encouragement rather than competition, comparison and criticism. Staff will have age-appropriate expectations and set up guidelines and environments that minimize the need for discipline.
- Staff respond to children with respect and consideration and treat all children equally, regardless of sex, race, religion or culture.
- Staff will serve as positive role models for youth by performing duties with respect, loyalty, patience, courtesy, tact and maturity.
- Staff may not be alone with children they meet in YMCA programs outside of the YMCA. This includes babysitting, sleepover and inviting children to your home. Any exceptions require a written explanation before the fact and are subject to administrator approval.
- Staff are not to transport children in their own vehicles. Any exceptions require supervisor approval.
- Staff communicate frequently with parents regarding day-to-day activities and encourage parents to report or question any behavior or event their child may share that appears out of the ordinary.
- Parents can visit, unannounced, any program their child participates in.

#### What to bring & what to wear?

##### ■ LUNCH

Is to be brought from home every day, preferably packed in a disposable bag with the child's name on it (lunch boxes tend to be forgotten).

Lunches are refrigerated until lunch time. Please note: send your child with a drink, or money to purchase a beverage.

##### ■ CLOTHES

All campers should wear regular play clothes and sneakers. (Please do not send campers in sandals). Parents should send children with appropriate cold and wet weather clothing.

##### ■ OTHER

Bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, insect repellent, etc. Please be sure the campers' name appears on these items to assure they will return home at the end of the camp day.

##### ■ CAMP STORE

Available for sale at the camp store is the latest in Camp Foskett t-shirts. Prepackaged snacks and juice drinks are also available for purchase.

This camp complies with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and is licensed by the local Board of Health.

##### ■ CAMP SITE

Camp Foskett is located on Daniels Road in Charlton, MA, on the South Charlton Reservoir. It is a beautiful 114 acres of forested land and wide open fields with cabins, tents, lodges, modern toilet facilities and a sanded beach area used daily for aquatic activities.

##### ■ CAMP HOURS

Monday-Friday 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

##### ■ PHONE NUMBER

Camp: 508-248-7541 (please call camp number during summer operation Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.)

##### ■ MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

A health form must be completed and returned to the YMCA the Friday before attending camp. HEALTH FORM REQUIRES DOCTOR SIGNATURE ON IMMUNIZATION HISTORY ONLY. The rest of the form may be completed and signed by parent.

##### ■ CAMPER AGE

It is mandatory that campers have completed kindergarten before attending camp.

##### ■ SWIM INSTRUCTION

Scheduled each day. Campers are tested and placed into classes based on his/her ability. Our swimming program provides instruction for beginners, intermediate, and advanced swimmers as outlined by the National YMCA Aquatics Program.

##### ■ CANCELLATION

In the event Camp Foskett cannot operate due to severe weather these radio stations: WESO (AM 970) and WSRS (FM 96.1) will air the announcement. If camp is closed early due to severe weather, every attempt will be made to contact parents by phone as well as announce the early closing on the radio. If we are unable to contact a parent, your child will be transported to the YMCA and be supervised by camp staff.

\* Campers cannot attend without completed health & registration forms on file at the YMCA.

### Extended Care

To help busy parents out, we have incorporated an Extended Care Program.\* This program provides supervision for your child & breakfast for those early morning drop offs (until 8:00 a.m.). Extended Care is available for school-aged children only from 6:45 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. There is no need to sign up for Extended Care.

You must purchase a punch card at the Front Desk in increments of either \$3.00 or \$6.00.

Morning time slot: \$1.50/child/day • Afternoon time slot: \$1.50/child/day.

Pickups after 6:00 p.m. will result in a \$1.00/minute/child charge.

**\*Extended Care is available only at the YMCA in Southbridge.**

At Camp Foskett we are proud of our camping program. Our extensive list of action-packed recreational activities are offered on our wooded 114 acre campsite.

#### ■ Campers are grouped by grades (1st-8th)

The camp is divided into a blue and a yellow unit. Every tribe is staffed by two counselors. Each tribe is named after an Indian tribe. Campers must have completed kindergarten.

Fee: \$115/wk for Members; \$160/wk for Non-Members.

#### ■ Senior Campers at Foskett (9th-10th gr.)

Our senior camping program offers older campers a chance to continue and expand on their camping experience. This program includes field trips to museums, other camps and other points of interest. All trips are included in camper fee. Senior campers must qualify for field trips. Qualifying includes demonstrating good campership.

Fee: \$130/wk Member; \$175/wk Non-Member.

#### ■ C.I.T. Program (15 yrs)

Camp also has a Counselor-in-Training Program for teens aged 15. This program trains young people to become counselors. Those interested must fill out an application from the Y and return it to Jim Flynn no later than June 18th. This will be followed by an interview. Only a limited number of applicants will be accepted. The cost is \$90.00 per week. We are proud of the fact that many of our counselors and staff administrators were at one time campers here at Foskett.

## Bus Information

To and From Camp Foskett ONLY (all other programs require parent drop off & pick up)

Transportation is provided from pre-determined stops selected for their convenience and safety. Children should be supervised at the bus stops at all times by a responsible person. 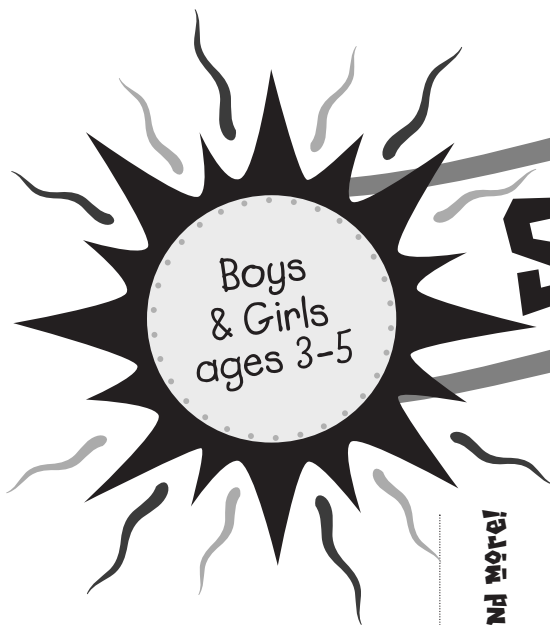
At Camp Running Bear, we will follow the themes of Camp but will challenge them with age-appropriate adventures. The themes of the week include:

**Swimming:** One 40-minute swim is provided weekly. Swim sessions include basic instruction in swimming with a focus on water safety, presented in a fun, recreational way. Swim teachers are YMCA and Red Cross Certified Water Safety Instructors and are certified in CPR and First Aid. Bring a labeled bathing suit and towel in a plastic bag. Campers will use the waterfront and swim in South Charlton Reservoir.

**Arts and Crafts:** Painting, collage and other "open-ended" activities are offered to promote creativity & fun!

**What to bring to camp:** Sunscreen, Bug Spray, Change of clothes in case of an accident. Bring a labeled bathing suit and towel in a plastic bag. PLEASE... no sandals or open-toed shoes at camp!

# Directions...

## ...to Camp Foskett

189 Daniels Road, Charlton, MA 01507

■ From Southbridge:

Go past Big Y on East Main Street.

Turn left and go over bridge onto Saundersdale Road.

Turn left at the stop sign. Go to the next stop sign.

Turn right and go up Dresser Hill Road.

At the next stop sign, continue straight across intersection onto Schoolhouse Road.

Take the second right onto Daniels Road.

Camp Foskett is 1.7 miles down Daniels Road on the left-hand side.

■ From Sturbridge:

From Route 20, once into Charlton, turn right onto Masonic Hill Road.

Continue up the road until you get to a stop sign, turn right onto Route 31, Main Street in Charlton.

Go through the center of Charlton.

Take a left onto Mudgett Hill Road. Go past Bay Path High School.

Take the first right after Bay Path onto Bond Road.

Go to the end of Bond Road.

Bear left as the road quickly forks.

Continue straight across onto Daniels Road.

Camp Foskett is 1.7 miles down Daniels Road on the left-hand side.

■ From Webster/Dudley: from Main Street, Route 197 in Dudley.

Turn at Dudley Fire Station onto Mason Road.

Turn left at first stop sign and go past Shepherd Hill High School.

Turn right at the next stop sign onto Ramshorn Road.

Follow Ramshorn Road approximately 2.2 miles.

Turn right onto Barrett Road.

Camp Foskett is .7 miles down Barrett Road on the right-hand side.

## How to Register:

Fill out all 4 sides of the Registration Packet completely, using one form per child (additional copies are available at the YMCA). Place an "X" in the white box that indicates which camp(s) and week(s) your child is applying for. Please note that not all camps run for a full day. Check descriptions for details. Drop off or mail the complete package, including application and payment for each session you have registered to: ATTN: Summer Camp Registration, Tri-Community YMCA, 43 Everett Street, Southbridge, MA 01550.

## ■ Refunds and Transfers:

If you need to change your summer camp plans, you can transfer your child to another session at no charge, provided that space is available. Refunds will only be considered with a doctor's note. 50% of the camp fees are nonrefundable. Refunds and transfers must be approved by the Camp Director. Refunds will not be given in the event of early dismissal for misconduct.

## ■ YMCA Membership

As a member of the Tri-Community YMCA, your child will receive the lowest camp rates available. Please note: Only memberships which are paid in full through the end of the Camp season September 2010 qualify for the YMCA Member Camp rate. Payment plan or Summer memberships do not qualify for the discounted rate. If your family or Youth Membership expires prior to September, only those weeks preceding the expiration date qualify for the discount. This may mean renewing in advance to qualify for additional weeks. A twelve-month youth membership is only \$88.00. Family and adult memberships are also available. Join today!

## ■ Payment Information:

Camp Foskett requires a minimum 50% non-refundable deposit per child per week. Camp Foskett July sessions must be paid in full by June 1. Camp Foskett August sessions must be paid in full by July 1. Scamper Camp & Summer Fun Club must be paid in full at the time of registration.

## ■ Financial Assistance:

The Tri-Community YMCA strives to make summer camp available to people of all socio-economic levels. We believe that individuals who participate in YMCA programs strengthen their spirit, mind, and body. While participants are expected to pay their fair share, financial support for summer camp is available.
